Reptiles make wonderful pets and are fun additions to any family. The average reptile does not display the signs of illness until very late in the course of their disease. Prior to their domestication this was necessary to avoid being singled out as prey by other animals. Unfortunately, this makes their medical and surgical care a special challenge. For this reason it is important to have your pet examined by a veterinarian **AT LEAST** once a year. Additionally because illness is often masked in these species, routine laboratory tests are highly recommended on an annual basis. Basic screening provides especially useful information when first obtaining your pet from a breeder or pet store.
